**BACKGROUND INFORMATION/PROJECT:**

In November 2016, 8 students of Plakaowittayakhan School attended the northeastern regional Glow Camp in Surin. After attending the camp, the 8 student leaders participated in the Glow Club activities on campus. In June 2017, 4 student leaders, along with the PCV and counterparts, attended the Glow Youth Leadership Summit in Samut Prakan. Returning from the summit with the promises of bring Glow back to our own community, this November, with the help of their PCV and CPs, these 4 students were the main leaders of Glow Kalasin Camp. We invited 3 schools in our district, students from P4 to M3. We also invited 5 129 PCVs in the nearby area to be their mentors, so they could take Glow back to their own communities after this camp.

For this camp, my counterpart and I decided to adapt the model of a BTF camp. For the first two days, we invited only the matayom students, while the prathom students attended during the last three days. And during the last three days, the matayom students took over as the “camp counselors,” facilitated the sessions and lead the prathom students under the supervision of the 4 student leaders and the PCVs. By facilitating sessions and running activities at the camp, the matayom students got a sense of what it is like to run a Glow club at their own schools. It is a process that helped them to develop leadership and confidence. After 5 days of observing and participating, the PCVs and their counterparts learned how to run Glow activities and how to take Glow back to their own communities.

**DESCRIBE HOW THE PROGRAM/PROJECT’S OBJECTIVES AND BENEFITS WERE MET:**

The counterpart and youth leaders who attended the Glow Youth Summit in Samut Prakan were given more opportunities to practice their leadership skills and to deliver their knowledge to different communities. The counterpart and youth leaders planned the schedule, facilitated sessions, led energizers and trained 16 matayom students and prepared them to become leaders for the rest of the camp.

For the first 2 days of the camp, 16 matayom students from 2 different schools in the PCV's community participated in activities led by the PCVS, the CP, and the youth leaders on various Glow topics such as leadership, self-respect, teamwork, sex and gender, etc. After 2 days of training, the matayom students became the leaders who then facilitated the same sessions and led 41 prathom students from 5 different schools in various activities. At the end of the camp, both the matayom and the prathom students summarized what they learned from the Glow leadership camps and how they can take the ideas and activities back to their own schools.

4 fellow PCVs, along with their counterparts, observed and participated in activities. The PCVs were given the Glow manual in English and Thai and will take Glow back at their own sites.

**DESCRIBE HOW THE PROGRAM/PROJECT SCHEDULE AND INITIATIVES WERE IMPLEMENTED:**

**GLOW/BROS KALASIN LEADERSHIP CAMP** was a 5-day camp hosted by the teachers and youth leaders of Plakaowittayakhan School from November 6 to November 10. For the first 2 days, 16 matayom students from 2 schools (m1-m3, m4-m6) attended, while for the last 3 days, 41 prathom students from 5 primary schools (p4-p6) attended.

**DETAIL ANY COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT (IF APPLICABLE):**

The teachers and youth leaders from Plakaowittayakhan School played crucial roles in planning and preparing for the camp. The sawnaw from the area office contributed to camp selection. The director and 2 representatives from the Kalasin Provincial Ministry of Social Development came to visit during the camp. Many teachers also came to visit and dropped off snacks for the students. The pawaws of participating schools, the head monk of the community, the leaders from the police station, representatives from the tessaban, sawnaws from the area office, and teachers from Plakaowittayakhan School all participated in the opening ceremony to show support. The pawaw and a few other community members also attended the closing ceremony, and delivered an inspiring speech and gave out prizes and certificates to the campers before they went home.

**DESCRIBE THE PROGRAM/PROJECT SUSTAINABILITY (IF APPLICABLE):**

A few schools and the teachers already have said they will present the Glow camp to their pawaws and host a 2-day mini Glow camp at their own schools. Some teachers also invited the youth leaders to facilitate sessions at future camps. Every participant, regardless of age and social status, has become more aware of the importance of leadership and teamwork.
